Boat Registration & Rental Dock Reminders:

All **New** boat owners must have completed the LSLCA Boating Safety Class before they can register any class boat with a motor for the 2025 boating season.

· **To register your boat for 2025 at the CA office,**
you must provide the following:

- **Original Boat Title & Motor Title** (outboard only) to prove ownership
(NO COPIES)
- Proof of insurance for Boat and Motor (outboard only)

NOTE: You MUST have all paperwork to receive your boat stickers

ONLINE BOAT REGISTRATION PAYMENT -

WHEN YOU PICK UP YOUR STICKERS: You must provide the following:

- **Original Boat Title & Motor Title** (outboard only) to prove ownership
(NO COPIES)
- Proof of insurance for Boat and Motor (outboard only)

NOTE: You MUST have all paperwork to receive your boat sticker

**** Please allow 2 business days after you submit your online payment.****

If you are out of town or unable to put your stickers on your boat please contact Water Patrol @ 636-625-3120 to make arrangements and avoid a fine.

PROCEDURES FOR CA BOAT LIFTS

Rental docks Only—Slips with an approved lift must pay \$825 Lift Deposit and fill out a Lift Agreement form at the Front Desk of the CA Office.

Please do **NOT** purchase a boat lift until the lift measurements can be verified to see if the lift will adequately fit inside your half of the rental slip!

All boat lifts must be installed inside their half (50%) of the rental slip with adequate space allowed between the 2 boat lifts. Most lifts cannot be over 10' wide for rental slips (measured from outside foot to outside foot).

ALL New & Used boat lifts require a 5-step approval process

Before a boat lift can be installed. This includes boat lifts being installed in personal docks...and CA rental docks. It is the owner's responsibility to submit the paperwork to get approval. If a boat lift is installed *without* a permit, the CA can demand that it be removed permanently at the owner's expense. The 5-Step Lakefront Project Approval form must be completed along with the regular application for all Lakefront projects (Including docks, lifts & seawalls).

BOATING SAFETY COURSES

These courses are done in person. This is a one time course;
if you have taken our class there is no need to take it again.

BECOMING A BETTER BIRDER (PART TWO) | TUESDAY, JULY 22, 7 pm. LSLCA Clubhouse Ballroom A

For less experienced birdwatchers, or even those entirely new to the hobby, *Wings Over Lake Saint Louis* is hosting a second event to help you learn about the birds of Lake Saint Louis. Professor Scott Ellis, a member of the club, will present another bird ID lesson designed for "non-biology majors" at the Lake Saint Louis Community Association Clubhouse (100 Cognac Court) Ballroom A, on Tuesday evening, July 22, at 7 pm. With decades of teaching and scientific research under his belt, this session is a must-do for anyone seeking to improve their ornithological skills. In June, Scott showed photos of common birds such as ducks and other waterfowls, gulls and terns and herons, hawks, eagles, owls, woodpeckers, and kingfishers, and more; all typically found in the beginning half of avian field guides. In part two, he will focus on the common perching and songbirds and again talk about how to distinguish them. There is no cost to attend, and if you have one, participants should bring along their favorite Field Guide to assist with Scott's lesson approach. We hope to see you there! New club members, guests, and others are welcome to attend.

JARDIN DU LAC ~ JULY GARDEN OF THE MONTH - 8 MARNE DRIVE

Each year in July, the Jardin du Lac Garden of the Month is given to a backyard garden alternating between the big lake, small lake, and the Community Association Golf Course. This year Christina Winkler's backyard garden at 8 Marne Drive ,which looks out at holes 7, 8, and 9 (dubbed the Winkler Triangle in the 1980's) is being honored as the July 2025 Garden of the Month.

This mature garden represents a family legacy that began in 1973 when at 2 1/2 years old , Christina moved into the home with her parents and siblings. Her family began cultivating a backyard yard garden that encouraged visitors to drop in and make themselves at home. In 2015, Christina bought the family home and continues to build upon the family legacy that is so dear to her.

The majestic trees including a variety of oak, cedar , redbud, and blue spruce draw attention to well thought out small vignettes that can be used to enjoy the garden. Nicely placed and distributed in the vignettes are Rose of Sharon, pachysandra, azalea, hydrangea, tall phlox, prickly pear , weigela, and lilac bushes. Black- eyed Susans , Lily of the valley, day lilies, knockout roses, and evening primrose add additional color. There is a water vignette with goldfish aplenty! However, no fishing allowed!

“ All are welcome “ is the essence of this family legacy garden. It beckons you to enter and revel in its history, friendliness, and beauty.
