2020 BOAT REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT** When you register/renew your boat(s) for the 2020 season, you MUST show proof of ownership by supplying the office with your original title for the boat and outboard motor if applicable and proof of current insurance coverage. If paying your registration online, please email your information to frontdesk@lslca.com. Also, Water Patrol wants to remind ALL CLASS 8 BOATS prior to the 2020 boat registration getting their stickers need to sign their annual letter stating that they will not use ballast of any kind. All 2020 boat stickers must be adhered to the boat if on or over the water or prior to your launching the boat on the lake.

Private Golf Carts used on the Golf Course in 2020 will require an annual inspection by a Golf Shack employee and an annual registration fee of \$25.00 paid at the time of the inspection. At the time you pay the \$25.00 fee, a sticker will be given to you that you MUST display on your private Golf Cart confirming you have had your annual inspection and paid your annual Golf Cart fee.

You will only be allowed to use your private golf cart on the Golf Course if you have your annual Golf Cart sticker displayed.

There is **NO golf cart parking on the grassy areas**. Our maintenance team works very hard to keep the CA landscaped, and repeated driving over the grass makes it difficult to keep the grass alive.

We are adding notice signs at the clubhouse alerting golf cart drivers to park in to the upper or lower parking lots. There is an additional parking lot next to the tennis courts that is also available to golf cart drivers. For everyone's safety, we will not allow golf carts to drive down to the pool or clubhouse beach area. Please keep your cart on pavement and off the grass.

REMINDERS—Please do not jump from or engage in horseplay on CA docks, seawalls, or bridges. CA cards will be confiscated from anyone who is found to be violating these rules.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS SO FAR IN 2020...



The biggest project for 2020 has been repairing and restoring the Main Marina Seawall. Over 300 ft. of sheet pilings were installed during this project. Construction began in late February and was completed by the end of March.

The seawall repair has an estimated 50+ year lifespan and has created more usable space at the Main Marina. Please stop by and check it out!



Other completed projects include re-tiling the swimming pool, restriping the Main Marina & Windjammer Parking Lots, improving the infrastructure at Windjammer including installing fiber internet and adding electrical access near the boat ramp. Upcoming projects include: replacing golf bunker #7, replacing VIP Water Patrol Boat, adding additional security camera to CA Marinas, and many more.

The LSLCA has engaged Magruder Construction to dredge Dauphine Cove & Regatta Bay beginning after Labor Day 2020. More information on dredging will be coming soon.
